## **1. Introduction**

The Road Safety Club of Government Degree College, Nankhari, in collaboration with the Women's Cell, organised an invited lecture on “Youth for Safer Roads: Empowering Responsible Drivers” on 22nd November 2025. The event aimed to raise awareness among students about responsible driving practices and to sensitise them to the rising number of road accidents and the role of youth in creating safer roads.

The session was attended by faculty members, student volunteers, and the general student body, reflecting the college's collective commitment to promoting road safety and responsible citizenship.

## **2. Welcome Address**

The session commenced with a warm welcome by Dr Punita Verma, in charge of both the Road Safety Club and the Women's Cell. She welcomed the invited speaker, Mr Ramesh Negi, SHO, Police Station Nankhari, on behalf of the Principal, staff, and students of GDC Nankhari.

Dr Verma introduced the speaker, highlighting his extensive experience in policing and road safety enforcement. She also briefly outlined the lecture's theme, emphasising the crucial role of youth in ensuring safer roads and responsible driving.

## **3. Session by the Resource Person**

Mr. Ramesh Negi began his address by acknowledging the college's effort in conducting such awareness programs. He discussed various road safety-related issues, focusing particularly on:

- Rash and negligent driving
- Drunk driving and its grave consequences
- Careless overtaking and overspeeding
- Real-life cases of road accidents caused by minor lapses in judgment
- Increasing road accident statistics and fatalities

Using practical examples and real case studies from his policing experience, he illustrated how small mistakes on the road can result in major tragedies.

## **Key Points Covered**

- Importance of safe driving practices, including wearing helmets, seat belts, and avoiding mobile phone use.
- Understanding and following traffic rules, signals, and road signs.
- Role of youth in promoting a safety culture and influencing peers.
- The need to step forward as Good Samaritans, helping road accident victims without fear of legal complications.
- Procedure for filing an FIR in case of a road accident.
- Overview of penalties and punishments for violating traffic rules as per the Motor Vehicles Act.

Mr Negi emphasised that responsible youth can significantly reduce road accidents by adopting disciplined driving habits and encouraging others to do the same.

#### **4. Interaction and Student Queries**

After the lecture, students actively participated in an interaction session where they shared their concerns and sought clarification on several aspects of road safety, FIR procedures, and penalties for traffic violations. The speaker addressed each query with clarity, making the session highly engaging and informative.

#### **5. Student Feedback**

The feedback received from the students was overwhelmingly positive. They appreciated:

- The speaker's practical insights
- The real-life examples that made them introspect about their own driving behaviour
- The relevance of the content to their daily lives
- The engaging and interactive nature of the session

Many students expressed that the session helped them understand the seriousness of road safety issues and motivated them to adopt safer practices.

The invited lecture achieved the following outcomes:

- Enhanced awareness among students about responsible driving and traffic rules.
- Encouraged students to practice safe driving and responsible citizenship.
- Educated students on Good Samaritan laws and confident responses in accident situations.
- Provided knowledge on legal procedures such as filing FIRs and understanding penalties.
- Inspired youth to take proactive steps in creating safer roads within their communities.

## 7. Vote of Thanks


